SELECTED LAWS AND CUSTOMS FOR VISITING THE CEMETERY

Please Note: The following are only general guidelines, for more detailed laws and customs please refer to your Rabbi.

Visiting the Cemetery

It is customary to visit the graves of family members after the passing away on the following occasions:

For the 1st Year after passing away -

- At the conclusion of the shiva (7 days after day of burial),
- At the conclusion of the shloshim (30 days after day of burial)
- At the 11 month and 12 month anniversaries.

Thereafter -

- On the anniversary (Hebrew date of passing away)
- Erev Rosh Hashana or Erev Yom Kippur (If this is not possible one should visit during the month of Elul and/or between Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur).
- Some have the custom to visit on Tisha B'Av

Note: If any of the above days fall on Shabbat or on a day when we do not customarily visit a cemetery the visit should always precede the day rather than be postponed.

It is NOT customary to visit the cemetery during the month of Nissan, Chol-ha-Moed (the intermediate days of the festivals of Pesach and Sukkot), Purim, Channukah, Rosh Chodesh, and the day after the festivals.

When visiting graves one should be mindful to pray to G-D for help in the merit of the deceased or ask the deceased to beseech G-D on one's behalf. One should never beseech the deceased directly.

During the first year of a person passing away it is improper to beseech the deceased to pray for one's personal needs, but rather pray solely for the elevation of the soul of the deceased.

There are special laws concerning the visitation of graves by Kohanim, therefore they should consult a Rabbi prior to visiting the graveside.

It is improper to make use of a tombstone by walking, sitting or leaning on it or do anything which denigrates the honour of the deceased.

Prior to leaving the cemetery some have the practice of visiting the graves of other relatives.

As a token of respect and to ensure the deceased is not forgotten it is customary to place a stone or pebble on the gravestone; indicating that the grave site was visited.

On leaving the cemetery all should wash their hands alternating three times on each hand. The washing vessel should not be handed to the next person. It is not customary to dry one's hands and no blessing should be said.

One who has not visited the cemetery for 30 days recites the following blessing before entering the burial area of the Jewish section of the cemetery.

Blessed are You, Lord, our G-d, King of the Universe, who formed you in judgment, and created you in judgment, and sustained you in judgment, and brought death to you in judgment; and knows the number of all of you in judgment; and who in the future will restore you to life and establish you in judgment. Blessed are You, O Lord, who restores life to the dead.

Your dead shall live; my dead bodies shall rise up. Awake and sing, you who dwell in the dust, for your dew is as the dew of light, and the earth shall bring life to the spirits of the dead.

When standing at the grave recite the following:

 $oldsymbol{ extstyle D}$ eace unto you, our masters and teachers. You and your companions and students. May your soul be bound up in the bond of life with the Lord, your G-d. Peace unto you and upon your resting place. Happy are you in this world, and it will be good for you in the World to Come. You sit in the high places of the righteous with the holy angels, the nobles of the sons of the Most High. May the Merciful One hasten your resurrection. May the Merciful One speed your rising up. Through your merit may the Lord, our G-d, rescue us from the oppression of the kingdoms, from blunders of troops, from pre-Messianic tribulations, and the judgment of Gehinnom.
